

1 INFO SESSION

The first step in fostering with Goshen is a simple Zoom call or meeting with one of our staff. This is when you can get your initial questions answered and meet some of the staff who will be supporting you along your journey.

2 COMPLETE TRAINING

IMPACT foster parent training equips you with the tools you will need as a foster parent. In each session, you'll also collaborate with other new foster parents. In the end, you will walk away prepared to begin your fostering journey with Goshen Homes.

3 GET LICENSED

The licensing stage is where we diligently ensure your home and family is ready in every aspect for the challenges and blessings fostering can bring. Goshen Homes staff will walk you through paperwork and home preparations to complete your licensing.

4 START FOSTERING

Your paperwork is turned in. Your training is completed. Your home is licensed. Now it's time to start fostering!

Your support from Goshen Homes doesn't end here. You'll be equipped with continuous training and oncall staff support along the way.

RESPITE

As a respite foster parent, you are able to have an incredible impact on a foster child without the full-time commitment of having them live in your home. Respite care allows our foster parents to take a breather and recharge by providing care for things like date nights and vacations.

PRIMARY

Our primary foster parents become full-time caretakers to the foster youth placed in their care.



As a licensed sibling reunification agency, Goshen Homes focuses on foster homes able to take in 2 or more youth.

BABYSITTING

FURTHER TRAINING How will I be equipped to foster?

TBRI® is an attachment-based, traumainformed intervention that is designed to meet the complex needs of vulnerable children.

While a variety of parenting strategies may be successful in typical circumstances, children with histories of harm need caregiving that meets their unique needs and addresses the whole child. TBRI® will equip you with the tools you need to provide trauma-informed care to the foster kids in your home.

Together Facing the Challenge

Goshen Homes is certified in Together Facing the Challenge (TFTC), officially credentialing the foster care provider with an evidence-based approach.

TFTC certification means that Goshen Homes is ables to provide foster parents with a proven therapeutic foster care training and coaching program.

Our goal is to ensure that you are equipped to best care for the children in your home, learning systems that make fostering less confusing and taking care of yourself in the process. This will lead to foster youth experiencing more stable placements and greater lifelong outcomes.





How will Goshen support me during my fostering journey?

Respite

Respite care allows our foster parents to take a breather and recharge by providing care for things like date nights and vacations.

It can be tough to find childcare, so Goshen Homes is equipped to help you with approved babysitters.



What's different about fostering with Goshen?

Goshen Homes foster parents get licensed quicker, receive more support from case managers with smaller case sizes, and receive the best training possible to equip them to create great outcomes for the youth in their homes!

How much room do I need in my house to foster?

Foster youth of the same gender can share a bedroom, so as long as you have one open bedroom you can foster with Goshen.

How many kids would I have to foster with Goshen?

75% of siblings get separated during their time in foster care, and part of our mission is to help siblings stay together. Because of this, all Goshen Homes foster parents commit to placements of 2 or more children.

Can I foster if I am renting a house or apartment?

Yes! Home ownership is not a requirement for fostering with Goshen.

What counties do you work with?

Goshen licenses foster homes located in Cherokee, Cobb, Bartow, Paulding, and Pickens Counties.

What is respite foster care?

A respite foster parent gets fully licensed to foster, but rather than having children placed in their home full-time, they serve as a temporary placement. This scheduling is done at the availability of the respite parent and often consists of date nights for the primary foster parent, emergency coverage, or special events. Respite parents often describe their role as being "cool aunt or uncle" to a foster child.

Can single people foster?

Yes! Some of our best foster parents are single, especially many of our respite parents.
